Retaining public's feedback should be priority for SKSD

At that meeting the board voted on a revised draft policy on how they will allow public comments; the prior "draft" changes that the board chair wanted incorporated ended up on the cutting room floor!

The lesson for all of us here is to read all SKSD board statements thoroughly and carefully. Over a course of several meetings the South Kitsap School District Board chairman worked to change oral public comments policies. He drafted a new version of the District and Board's Governance Culture Policy (GC-12) on public meetings and public comments.

That recent draft nearly escaped full board scrutiny, but for two of the newest members on the board finding it odd. These two board directors spotted the same ambiguities that many in our community had also spotted and became vocal about at the meeting held on 02-21-24. Corrections were offered, voted on, and approved. The are now incorporated in the SKSD Board/District GC-12 Public Meetings Policy.
