South Kitsap School Board member Rebecca Diehl stepped down as president of the school board but did not resign from her elected office. The school board continues to acquiesce by not demanding her to resign. She's had two DUIs in three years and recently stated: "It has been a good thing in my life."

Ms. Diehl lied to the State Trooper, telling him she was not drinking; refused to take a sobriety test; caused a motor vehicle accident; plead not guilty; was convicted of DUI; sentenced to 364 days in jail and is now on probation till 2024.
