
This **replacement levy is no** will continue to:

- Provide opportunities to kee engaged like libraries, arts and clubs


# How Do We Spend Local Levy Dollars?



# Local Levy Supports Critical Staffing:




#### Levy Rate in South Kitsap Over Time:



#### **Reduced State Revenue**

Local Effort Assistance, which is awarded to Districts with lower values, has declined as property values in South Kitsap have in resulting in over \$3M in reduced resources since 2018.



## Past Reductions During Fund Instability

- When the local levy limit was \$1.50/thousand, we anticipated redu \$10 million dollars. Mid-stream in that process, the legislature rais which reduced our need to constrict but still resulted in the follow educational program:
  - Elementary Assistant Principals
  - Various teaching positions
  - Middle School Instructional Specialists
  - Athletic Director
  - Communications office support
  - Two security positions
  - Transportation position (in current budget for restoration but u hiring)

#### **Election Process**

- The Board of Directors must pass a resolution to place a the ballot
- The resolution must be filed with the Kitsap County Electron Office not later than December 11, 2020
- Election costs are shared among those on the ballot (ele costs are County-wide)
  - In 2017, our share of election costs was \$130,659, which election shared with Bainbridge Island SD's levy. Total cos \$184K.
- Election Day is February 9, 2021
